Becoming a DEQ-licensed Asbestos Abatement Contractor, Certified Worker or Certified Supervisor



Before renovating or demolishing any facility in Oregon, including but not limited to buildings, ships, equipment and recreational vehicles, contractors as well as business and property owners must have an accredited inspector complete an asbestos survey to determine if there are asbestos-containing materials. If the survey report identifies asbestos-containing materials, an asbestos abatement contractor with a license from the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality must perform any friable asbestos abatement.

Refer to <u>Oregon Administrative Rules 340-248-0120</u> and <u>340-248-0130</u> to see licensing and certification requirements in their entirety.

How to become a DEQ-licensed asbestos abatement contractor

- Register with the <u>Oregon Construction Contractors Board</u>.
- Register with the <u>Oregon Business Registry</u>.
- Fill out the DEQ application form and pay the applicable fee using <u>Your DEQ Online</u>.
- Provide the following information on the application:
 - The names and certification numbers of all Oregon certified supervisors employed by the applicant
 - Workers compensation coverage
 - CCB registration number
 - Oregon Business Registry Corporate Division registration number
 - All asbestos-related certificates and licenses issued during the one-year period immediately preceding the application submittal
 - Any asbestos-related enforcement actions received by the applicant
 - All notified friable and non-friable asbestos abatement projects conducted during the last year.

How to become a DEQ-certified asbestos abatement worker or supervisor

- Choose an <u>accredited training provider</u>. Classes may be limited in size due to COVID-19 restrictions.
- Fill out the DEQ application form.
- Submit the completed application to the selected training provider.
- Request to take the Oregon refresher class instead of the initial class if you have current worker or supervisor certification from another state. Provide a copy of your certification or state-issued card.
- If you are applying for asbestos supervisor certification, at a minimum you must provide documentation of:
 - One year performing full-scale friable asbestos abatement
 - Time on a powered air-purifying respirator
 - At least 10 separate friable asbestos abatement projects
