Dear Ms. Eades:

On April 12, 2019, the Department of Land Conservation and Development (DLCD) received the federal consistency application package from Jordan Cove Energy Project LP and Pacific Connector Gas Pipeline Project, LP (Applicants).

The federal Coastal Zone Management Act (CZMA) of 1972, as amended, requires that activities permitted by federal licenses and permits, and which affect any use or resource of a state's coastal zone, be consistent with that state's coastal management program. This process is known as "federal consistency." Your project is proposed to occur within the boundaries of Oregon's coastal zone, and will affect coastal uses and resources. The 1987 Oregon Legislature designated DLCD as the state agency that implements the Oregon Coastal Management Program (Program) and undertakes the CZMA federal consistency review in Oregon. The federal regulations applicable to this project are available at 15 CFR Part 930, Subpart D. DLCD is reviewing two major federal permits/licenses needed for the proposed project: the Army Corps Section 404/Section 10 permit and the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission's energy siting certificate. In the case of multiple federal permits for one project, per 15 CFR § 930.59, DLCD has asked the Applicants for one federal consistency application so that these two federal permits/licenses can be reviewed together.

DLCD's review will determine the proposed project's consistency with the

Program. To be consistent with the Program, the proposed project must comply with enforceable policies contained in: 1) the statewide land use planning goals; 2) the applicable acknowledged city or county comprehensive plan and land use regulations; and 3) selected state authorities (e.g. those governing removal-fill, water quality, and fish & wildlife protections). [The enforceable policies for the project have been identified.](#) More enforceable policies will apply as more information is available from the local jurisdictions reviewing the Applicant's local applications.

Per 15 CFR § 930.60(a)(1), before consistency review occurs as described above, DLCD has 30 days to review whether the application includes all necessary data and information (NDI). To initiate federal consistency review, applicants must provide DLCD with the NDI required by 15 CFR § 930.58.

Your consistency review has been initiated. The NDI required has been submitted and is described in Table 1.

If DLCD has not issued a decision by July 12, 2019, we will notify you of the status of the federal consistency review and the basis for delay. Under 15 CFR § 930.60(b), Applicants and DLCD may mutually agree in writing to stay our federally mandated six-month review period which ends October 12, 2019. A stay may be beneficial because the Program is a “networked” program that integrates authorities of local governments and other state agencies, and DLCD will not concur that a proposed project is consistent with the Program until the applicant has obtained the approvals from local government and state agencies with regulatory authority for the project listed in Table 2.

If DLCD issues an objection because the proposed project is not consistent with Program enforceable policies the federal permits cannot be issued. If you have
