

Oregon Recreational Boating Incident Statistics – 2019

The following statistics were taken from boating incident reports received by the State Marine Board for 2019. Incidents involving death, injury, or boat and/or property damage of \$2,000 or more must be reported.

In 2019, we had 18 fatalities in recreational boating incidents in Oregon; one above 2018. The oldest fatal was 76 and the youngest was 18.

Five out of the 18 fatalities were wearing life jackets. The fatalities that warrant mentioning are two of the fatalities rented a boat, two were due to Carbon Monoxide Poisoning and nine were sole operators. Of the 18 fatalities it is reasonable to assume that if 13 of the victims worn their life jackets, they would probably have survived their incidents.

Seven of the 18 fatalities were in motorized boats (two fatalities each from two separate boats); nine were in a non-motorized boat.

Nine of the 18 fatalities were 50 years old or older. 12 out of the 18 fatalities, the victim was the operator and nine out of the 12 was also a sole occupant on a boat. Of the nine sole occupants on a boat, five out of the nine boats were non-motorized.

The number one cause of fatal incidents this year was operator inexperience or error; however, there were five fatalities where the cause was unknown.
