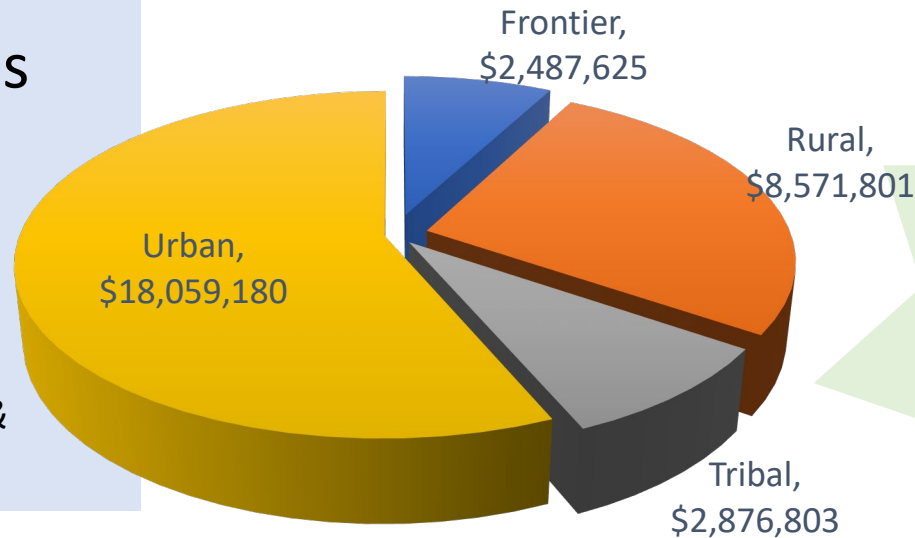


ATC Funding Across Oregon...

- **\$31.9 Million***
- **Funded 66 grantees**
- **Developed new infrastructure across Oregon.**

**Total amount spent on ATC grants was \$39.9 million dispersed by OHA for services such as Harm Reduction & rental assistance.*

Access to Care (ATC) grants were bridge funding for organizations to build infrastructure and maintain access to services prior to the availability of Behavioral Health Resource Network (BHRN) funding.



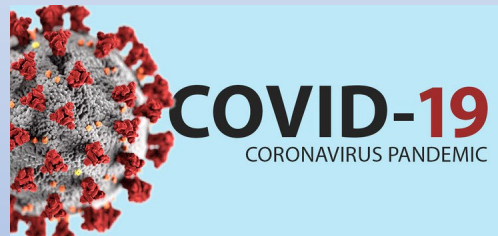
ATC created over 200 new jobs and staff training for Peer Support Specialists, CRMs & CADC, Doulas and many more.

Created homes, shelters, recovery centers, community & counseling rooms, and harm reduction services.

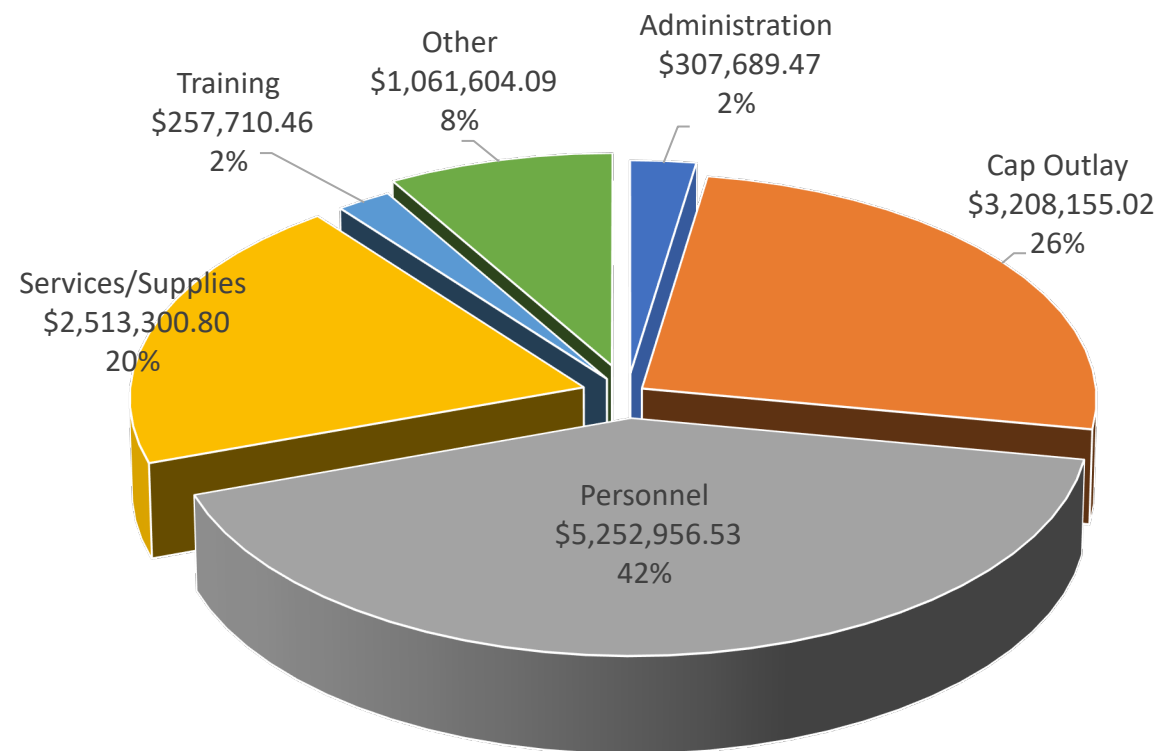
Devastating the Communities and the Nation, we had to adapt and work together.

Expenditures...

Approximately 80% of ATC Grantees submitted quarterly expenditure reporting.

The pie chart to the right only reflects expenditure reporting received by OHA.

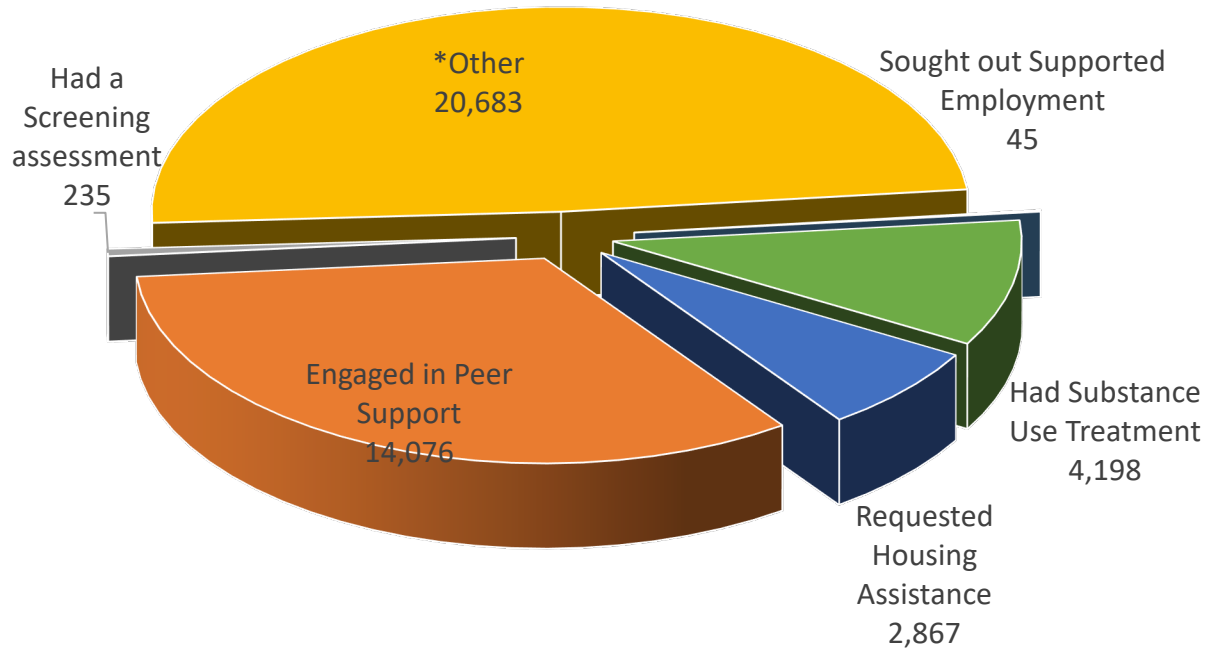
OHA is currently working with ATC Grantees to collect full expenditure reporting across all ATC grant agreements, amendments and extensions.

The total number of persons served is 42,104 (see pie chart). These numbers come from narrative reports submitted by Access to Care grantees November 2022. The earlier count of 16,076 was taken from narrative reports submitted March 2022.

Most expenditure reports from the Access to Care grantees were based on quarterly information, not cumulative counts. The narrative reports did not have a template to follow and could range from one paragraph only to multiple pages.

Client used all his Narcan to reverse an overdose another person while on his way to an appt. - clinic congratulated him and gave him a new supply.

Creating programs assisting BIPOC women with income who need stabilization for 12–18-months.

“Accept people right where they are at and use that as a starting point.”

A Sobering Center in Southern Oregon that has eased the local ER’s burden and has served as a stepping-stone to residential treatment and detox services.
