

Integrated Co-occurring Disorders (ICD) Program Development, Staff Support and Technical Assistance

To help approved provider organizations develop their ICD programs, Oregon Health Authority (OHA) ICD staff are available to provide informal and structured technical assistance at no cost.

OHA strongly encourages approved provider organizations to participate in OHA's ongoing program development technical assistance, described below. These activities and tools:

- Are not required but are, again, strongly encouraged.
- Meet the ICD requirements of Oregon Administrative Rules (OARs) 309-019-0145 and 309-018-0160.

ICD Program Development Snapshot

Use the <u>Program Development Snapshot</u> to document your ICD program's current state and develop goals for your Program Development Roadmap.

- Complete the snapshot collaboratively with OHA ICD staff within 90 days of initial approval.
- Information from the snapshot will help you create your Program Development Roadmap.

OHA also advises programs to update their Program Development Snapshot during their scheduled site review with the Division's Licensing and Certification Unit.

ICD Program Development Roadmap Check-ins

The Program Development Roadmap will identify focus areas for developing your ICD program.

- OHA recommends programs have their staff participate in at least one Program Development Roadmap check-in every six months.
 - The check-in is a collaborative, developmentally oriented discussion with OHA ICD staff to review your program's Roadmap.

OHA also recommends that programs review their Roadmap quarterly with ICD staff collaboration..

Dual Diagnosis Capability in Addictions Treatment (DDCAT) and Dual Diagnosis Capability in Mental Health Treatment (DDCMHT) Indices

OHA encourages but does not require completion of the DDCAT/DDCMHT indices in the technical assistance process.

- The DDCAT and DDCMHT are internationally recognized and validated tools for assessing your organization's capacity to provide co-occurring disorders treatment.
- OHA will use DDCAT and DDCMHT data to inform program development, conduct structural outcomes studies and evaluate programs.

Community of Practice Consultation Groups for ICD Program Staff

OHA encourages ICD provider staff to participate in <u>ICD Community of Practice Groups</u> held multiple times per month.
