FINDINGS OF FACT

- (1) On September 9, 2011, Student's Parents filed a request for due process hearing with the State Superintendent of Public Instruction on behalf of Student.
- (2) On October 17, 2011, Senior Administrative Law Judge Joe L. Allen held a prehearing conference. At the conference, the parties informed ALJ Allen that mediation in this matter was scheduled for October 24, 2011. At the parties' request, ALJ Allen scheduled a status conference for November 4, 2011 to allow appropriate time for settlement discussion.
- (3) On November 4, 2011, ALJ Allen held a status conference to determine whether any issues remained for hearing after mediation. At the conference, counsel for both parties represented they were close to an agreement and believed further settlement talks could resolve all issues without the need for hearing. A second status conference was scheduled for November 21, 2011.
- (4) On November 18, 2011, Counsel for Parents, Lana Traynor, informed the OAH that the parties had reached an agreement on all issues. Ms. Traynor indicated the parties were in the process of memorializing the agreement, after which Parents would request dismissal of the due process complaint. The status conference set for November 21, 2011 was cancelled pending dismissal.
- (5) On December 14, 2011, Parents notified the Office of Administrative Hearings, via email, that they wished to withdraw the hearing request with prejudice.

ORDER

The September 9, 2011 request for a due process hearing has been withdrawn and the case is dismissed with prejudice.
