Lead Organization	Adrian School District
Goal #1	95% of students experiencing poverty (SEP) will graduate on-time.
Short-Term Outcome	95% of the class of 2023 will graduate on time.
Long-Term Outcome	Each SEP graduation checklist will be examined three times a year with building administrator and graduation specialist.
Goal #2	95% of our ninth grade SEP will be on-track to graduate.
Short-Term Outcome	Ninth grade SEP graduation checklists will be evaluated with the building administrator and graduation specialist each quarter.
Long-Term Outcome	The district will offer summer school and after school opportunities for ninth grade SEP to take recovery credit if needed. Transportation will not be a barrier to these opportunities.
Goal #3	100% of our SEP will be aware of college credit and dual credit class opportunities. 100% of our SEP will be given the opportunity to take the Accuplacer exam for college placement.
Short-Term Outcome	75% of our students will take the Accuplacer.
Long-Term Outcome	The district will find ways to make financial burden a non barrier to placement in college credit and dual credit courses.
Goal #4	The district will create a computer science CTE pathway for SEP.
Short-Term Outcome	The district will offer APCSP or Computer Science 160.
Long-Term Outcome	By 2025, the district will offer a computer science pathway that will lead to Computer 161 credit or Web Design certification.
Dropout Prevention Activity #1	The most important activity to reaching our focal student group is to fund a graduation specialist that tracks the graduation requirements of students 8-12. The graduation specialist will head up our efforts to ensure that 95% of students experiencing poverty will graduate on time, while also ensuring that student group is on-track to graduate after ninth grade. The specialist will head up efforts to provide the teaching staff with necessary data to ensure our efforts towards graduation. The graduation specialist will also be enrolling students in the classes they need to graduate, while also steering students to advance placement courses and CTE pathways. Another major function of the graduation specialist is to guide 8th grade students toward their educational pathway that best fits their academic goals. He/She would provide that guidance throughout the year, but especially during 9th grade orientation at the end of the school year. Overall, the function of our graduation specialist is to foster the goals of Adrian HSS plan.

A current staff member would be offered a stipend to be an after-school coach. This staff member would be responsible for being here after school to provide recovery credit options, as well as time to meet the needs of students who are struggling in current classes. Transportation will be provided to all who need it in order to meet the needs of those students experiencing poverty, that may not have transportation after school due to parents working. This will be advertised through our newsletter and other publications by the school.

This assessment is essential to placement in college level courses, however, any of our students experiencing poverty do not have access to this assessment. They would be required to travel to the nearest community college and pay for the examination. Any dual credit course that a student receives a C or better will be paid for through HSS funds.

Adrian High School will add a CTE pathway in computer science. This pathway would begin at the 8th grade level in a class called "Transitions". Ninth grade will be enrolled in Intro to Computer Science. 10th grade in "Exploring Computer Science", 11th grade in APCSP or Computer 160, and the capstone class would be Computer Science 161. The end goal of our Computer Science program would be college credit or a web design certification. In order to add this program, we would need to buy Computer Science Curriculum as well as make continuous updates to our technology lab. We would also need to send our CTE teacher to trainings and work on different certifications towards teaching computer science.
