Lead Organization	Trask River High School
Goal #1	All Trask River High Students will participate in at least one class in each of our (developing) CTE programs. These programs encourage hands-on (tactile) learning which is a successful strategy for working with students which are trauma adverse. These opportunities include Horticulture which is in Trask River Agricultural Program (TRAP), and Construction and Welding which are in Trask River in Productions (TRiP) .
Short-Term Outcome	Trask River High School will take steps to bring two additional full-time CTE teachers to our teaching team. We are in the process of transitioning our Trask River Agricultural Program director into a licensed CTE teacher under the Agricultural Program of Study at Tillamook High School. We will also add a full time welding teacher under the our Construction Trades Program of Study. During the 2021-2023 biennium, all students will complete a CTE exploratory wheel in horticulture, construction, and welding. Staff will work directly with students in planning their schedules to ensure enrollment in CTE courses.
Long-Term Outcome	A fully developed Construction Trades Program of Study and Agricultural Program of Study of Study will enable our students to earn a CTE certificate reflecting the completion of 5 or more classes in a particular program of study. Students will also have the opportunity to earn dual high school and college credit. By the end of the 2024-2025, 25% of our students will have earned a CTE Program Certificate or at least one college credit.
Goal #2	Trask River High School will add the opportunity for students to earn dual credit during their high school experience.
Short-Term Outcome	By the end of the 2022-2023 school year, 25% of the Trask River High School students will have earned at least 2 college credits.
Long-Term Outcome	By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, 50% of Trask River High School students will earn at least 2 college credits.
Dropout Prevention Activity #1	All students will participate in relevant CTE activities including horticulture, construction, welding, and the Trask River Agricultural Program which works with the CTE coordinator in the Tillamook Agricultural Program of Study. Plans to add staff to support this work and progress toward programs of study in Construction Trades and Agriculture.
