Judy Newman and Kara Williams gave the legislative update. The Governor is served by Councils and EI/ECSE serves on one of those Councils and all make recommendations to the Governor's Racial Justice Council so that a comprehensive approach to P-k-12 can be done.  Patricia Cavanaugh said OCDC is continuing to provide emergency childcare. Lisa McConahie updated on Regional programs. They are providing distance support and technology to families. Funding has come through ODE. They are partnered close with EI/ECSE providers.
