

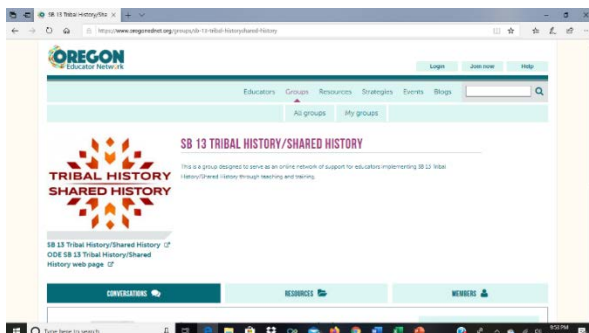
## SB 13 Tribal History/Shared History

### Monthly Update – March 2020

- Greetings! February was a busy month for SB 13 Tribal History/Shared History. We hosted our second *Train the Trainer* event on February 20 at Chemeketa Winema. This was the second of a two-part Train the Trainer series. There were over 50 educators in attendance from all across the state.
- This event served as an opportunity for educators to learn more about the new statewide SB 13 Tribal History/Shared History curriculum. It was a *continuation* of the December 12, 2019, Train the Trainer event. At this event we dove deeper into the lesson plans through modeling and activities. It was a day of discussion, discourse, learning and sharing. Attendees received knowledge and tools to help them be successful at training others on this curriculum.
- A big thank you to all of the *amazing* facilitators that assisted at the event. We received a blessing of aboriginal lands by Michael Langley, Tribal Council Member of the Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde. Presentations were given by Mercedes Jones, Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde; Sonya Moody-Jurado, Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians; Suzanne Hidde, ODE; Amit Kobrowski, ODE; and a discussion forum led by Dr. Leilani Sabzalian, University of Oregon Indigenous Studies in Education and Sapsik'wałá Teacher Education Program.
- **We now have 51 educators that have successfully attended both of the Train the Trainer events.** They will be placed on a resource list on the ODE website for districts/organizations looking for support and assistance in implementing SB 13 Tribal History/Shared History.
