



## DRUG AND ALCOHOL TESTING PROGRAM CERTIFICATION

Oregon law requires motor carriers (owners of commercial trucks subject to motor carrier regulations contained in ORS Chapter 825) to certify, at the time of vehicle registration or renewal;

- That they have an in-house drug and alcohol testing program that meets the federal requirements of 49 C.F.R. part 382, or
- That they are a member of a consortium, as defined in 49 C.F.R. 382.107, that provides testing that meets the federal requirements.

To help you comply with this requirement we are providing this certification statement. In order to register your vehicle you must certify that you are in compliance with the federal law or that you are exempt from this law.

Please complete and sign the certification and include it with your application.
