



ACCEPTABLE ID FOR MARIJUANA

A recreational marijuana retailer must verify the age of a person purchasing or acquiring marijuana items. A person must be 21 years of age to purchase marijuana for recreational purposes, or 18 years of age if acquiring marijuana as a registry identification cardholder.

Under Oregon Law only the following ***non-digital, unexpired, and unaltered*** forms of identification are acceptable alone as proof of age when purchasing or acquiring* marijuana items:

1. **Driver license from a U.S. state, District of Columbia, or a province or territory of Canada.**
2. **ID card with photo, name, date of birth, and physical description issued by a U.S. state, District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, Guam, Northern Mariana Islands, United States Virgin Islands, or American Samoa, or a province or territory of Canada.**
3. **ID card issued by a federally recognized Indigenous American tribe with photo, name, physical description, and date of birth.**
4. **Passport or passport card.**
5. **U.S. military ID card.**
6. **NEXUS or SENTRI card.**

** A marijuana retailer may require ID from a person in addition to what is listed above only if the ID is the person's registry identification card as defined in ORS 475B.791.*

ORS 475B.216, 475B.220, and OAR 845-025-2820(1)

Only the identification listed above are acceptable alone as proof of age. Following are examples of identification that **ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE ALONE** as proof of age:

- Green card
- FAST card
- Prison ID card
- Gun or Firearms permit, including a permit which allows the carrier to carry a weapon in public in a concealed manner
- IDNYC card (New York City Identification card)
- Social Security card
- Pilot's license
- Veteran Health Identification card
- Student ID cards
