



Propane Grills

Prior to Use:

1. Open the lid before turning on the grill.
2. Turn on the propane tank.
3. Turn on the knobs of the grill burner.
4. Push the ignition button (if you have one).

If the grill doesn't ignite, let gas dissipate for at least 5 minutes before attempting to light the grill again.

After Use:

1. Turn off propane tank first, then turn off the grill burners.
2. Ensure the grill has fully cooled before covering.

If you smell gas while cooking, immediately get away from the grill and call the fire department.

Bubble Test

Check the tank hose for leaks before using it for the first time each year. Apply a light soap and water solution to the hose. A propane leak will release bubbles. If your grill has a gas leak, by smell or soapy bubble test, and there is no flame, turn off both the gas cylinder and the grill. If the leak does not stop, call the fire department.

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GRILLING FIRE SAFETY



PREVENT | PREPARE | ACT

PREVENT

Grills must only be used OUTDOORS.

Place grills at least 3 feet away from siding, deck railings, overhanging branches, or eaves.

Keep children and pets at least 3 feet away from grill or campfire.

Keep grill on a stable surface where it can't tip over.



PREPARE

Light grills with cover open.

Consult local fire agency for outdoor fire or recreational fire bans.

Use and maintain grill using manufacturer's instructions.

Have a 4-A fire extinguisher nearby.

ACT

Stay alert. Watch what you grill.

Clean your grill after each use.

Dispose of coals in metal container only after they are cool.
