- Identify where your pets spend most of their time to plan a quick exit.
- Keep a leash or pet carrier in an accessible place, being mindful not to create a tripping hazard.
- Make sure all household members know the plan and what to do if the smoke alarm sounds.

Make sure pets are included in your family's wildfire evacuation plan! If your pet is inside during a fire, do not go back into your house. Wait for firefighters to arrive, then tell them where your pet might be or where they typically hide.

- Switch to flameless candles and never leave a lit candle unattended.
- Create a safety zone around heat sources, including fire pits and barbeques.

Preparedness kits aren't just for humans! Create an evacuation kit for your pets while building your own. When an immediate evacuation is necessary, having a plan and essential items prepared will help. Consider including:

• Documentation (pet health insurance policy, veterinarian information, vaccine records, etc.)

- Leash, harness, collars, ID tags
- Photos of your pet to help identify ownership in the event your pet goes missing
- Pet food, water, and bowls for at least three days for each pet
- Waste bags
- Grooming supplies
- Toys Bedding/blanket
