

OREGON RECREATIONAL BOATING ACCIDENT STATISTICS - 1983

The following statistics were extracted from boating accident reports received by the Oregon State Marine Board for 1983 calendar year.

Comments on the year...

In 1983, 23 people died in recreational boat accidents. The total, below our annual average of 31, was comprised of accidents typical in terms of how, where, and to whom they occurred (see reverse side). As in the past boating fatalities happened to:

• Males, not wearing a life jacket, in small boats, less than 18 feet in length, on rivers, water temperature less than 60 degrees.

We had an unusually low number of boat accidents last year. A couple of reasons which may account for this significant decrease was the short salmon fishing season and a cool summer.
