

OREGON RECREATIONAL BOATING ACCIDENT STATISTICS - 1985

The following statistics were extracted from boating accident reports received by the Oregon State Marine Board for 1984 calendar year.

Comments on the year...

In 1985, 23 people were killed in recreational boating accidents. Since 1980, we have lost fewer than 24 boaters per year. This compares to an average of over 31 boaters per year during the 1970's.

Of the 23 fatalities, only 5 bodies were tested for blood alcohol content*. Of the 5 tested, 3 had blood alcohol levels above .08 (the legal level of intoxication on Oreogn's highways). The average blood alcohol content for the 3 was .23.

Research indicates that alcohol is a factor in 60% of all recreational boating accidents.

This past August we suffered our worst single boat accident this decade when 5 people lost their lives on the Columbia River Bar. The Marine Board strongly advises boaters to wear a life jacket whenever they boat on or near the bar and the ocean.

*Most victims were not tested because they were never recovered or their bodies were too decomposed to get an accurate reading.
