

OREGON RECREATIONAL BOATING ACCIDENT STATISTICS – 1989

The following statistics were extracted from boating accident reports received by the Oregon State Marine Board for 1989 calendar year.

Comments on the year...

In 1989, 16 people died in recreational boating accidents in Oregon. This total represents the second lowest number of boating deaths in a year since records have been kept (1964). In 1966, 15 people were lost in boating accidents.

The 1980's were a decade which saw continued improvement in boating safety as measured by boating accidents and fatalities. During the 80's less than 23 people died per year, down from the 70's average of 31.

The improvement occurred despite an increase in boat registration during the 80's of almost 30% and a greater variety of boats and activities on Oregon's waterways. The reduction in accidents can be attributed in large part to an increased effort in boating safety education and law enforcement.

The number of personal watercraft accidents continue to increase in 1989. There were ten accidents involving personal watercraft in 1989, up from 6 in 1988 and 3 in 1987. In May of 1990, the Board passed rules regulating the operation of personal watercraft.
