

# **OREGON RECREATIONAL BOATING ACCIDENT STATISTICS – 1991**

The following statistics were extracted from boating accident reports received by the Oregon State Marine Board for 1991 calendar year.

# Comments on the year...

In 1991, 22 people lost their lives in recreational boating accidents. Ten died in non-motorized boats, eight in canoes/kayaks. In many of these cases, there were life jackets on board but they were not worn. The water was cold (less than 70 degrees) and turbulent. Once the craft capsized, the victim was unable to put a life jacket on and had little time for rescue. The Marine Board advises people to always wear a life jacket when boating on cold water and on waterways that are rough or have a strong current.

We suffered one of our worst accidents in recent years when four people drowned boating off of Depoe Bay. The accident was not witnessed and there were no survivors so the cause of the accident is unknown. However, the boat's outboard engine had a history of malfunctioning and it is probable that there was engine trouble and the 16' boat capsized.

This was the second consecutive year that there were no fatalities on the Deschutes and Clackamas Rivers. We have averaged at least one fatal accident per year on each of these two rivers.

Six of the thirteen victims who were tested for alcohol content in their blood tested positive. Others were not tested due to age, body decomposition or because their bodies were never recovered.

There were eight accidents involving personal watercraft.
