Oregon Recreational Boating Fatality Statistics – 2021

The following statistics were taken from boating incident reports received by the State Marine Board for 2021. Incidents involving death, injury, or boat and/or property damage of \$2,000 or more must be reported.

Oregon had 18 recreational boating fatalities in 2021 – seven less than the 26 in 2020, which was the most since 1987. The oldest victim was 78 and the youngest was five.

Eight of the 18 victims were wearing life jackets. Of those eight: two were entrapped in a boats cabin when it capsized; one victim took his deployed inflatable off to escape from a capsized boat; one of the victims was paddling in Class II rapids and another paddling in Class IV-V rapids. Two fatalities involved minors: a 5-year-old girl died when trapped in a boat's cabin and a 10-year-old girl died when floating down a river in an inflatable raft when she fell out without a life jacket. Of the 19 fatalities it is likely that 10 of the victims would have survived their incidents had they been wearing a life jacket.

Six of the 18 fatalities were in non-motorized boats; 12 were in motorized boats (three double fatalities in three separate boats). Twelve of the 18 fatalities were 50 years old and older; two were five to 18 years old; and four were the age 19 to 49. The victims in six of the 18 fatalities were the operator and sole occupant on the boat; six were passengers; and six were the operator. Of the six sole-occupant fatalities, three were in non-motorized boats.

The primary cause of fatal incidents this year was operator error and then was split between operator inexperience and hazardous waters; however, there were two fatalities for which a specific cause was not determined.
