- A replacement structure must be located within the same lot or parcel as the damaged or destroyed structure.
- Other requirements are specific to each individual incentive.

- 2. I understand that this application is a public record and that the Oregon Department of Energy (ODOE) may be required by law to disclose information in this application to the public on request.
- 3. Oregon Department of Energy uses the statewide accounting system to make payments to individuals and vendors. If the participating individual or vendor has a garnishment, the amount owed to the individual or vendor by Oregon Department of Energy can be garnished. About the Program

In 2021, the Oregon legislature passed HB 5006, allocating \$10 million to the Oregon Department of Energy for incentives to promote energy efficient rebuilding of structures destroyed during the 2020 Labor Day wildfires.



The incentives will help those wildfire survivors rebuild site-built homes, manufactured homes, multi-family homes, and commercial structures with current- or above-code energy buildingstandards.

Program Timeline

Requests for the incentive will be accepted through May 31, 2025, or until all funds have been allocated, whichever comes first. All projects must be completed and documentation submitted to ODOE before June 30, 2025.

How to Receive an Incentive

- Confirm eligibility to participate.
