Applications will be accepted on any regular business day from January 5, 2009- June 30, 2009 between the hours of 9:00 am and 5:00 pm only.

Applications will be processed on the first business day of the month following the month in which they are received.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

17 years of age and have a high school diploma
OR be at least 18 years of age and have a GED
Must provide proof of age and education (high school diploma or GED test scores)

All applicants must also:

- Complete Trade orientation provided by the sponsor.
- Complete the sponsor's Construction Safety Training (OSHA 10 Hour).
- Complete an interview with the committee.

NOTES:

- A) Selection will be through ranking of applicants. Applications received by the close of each application period will be rated as a group and the names of the new successful applicants will be added to the qualified applicant list. All supporting documents must be submitted by noon on the day of the trade orientation.
- B) Employers may require a valid driver's license and drug testing.
- C) VETERANS who have GI Benefits may use them in this program.

ON THE JOB TRAINING

Approximately 8,000 hours of on-the-job training are required for completion of apprenticeship.

Carpenters apprentices will learn form building, pre-fabricated concrete installation, rough framing, outside finishing, inside finishing, acoustical and drywall, finish hardware, layout, care and use of tools and woodworking machinery, walkways and shed construction, safety and protection device construction, installation of pre-fabricated modules, and scaffolding.

RELATED TRAINING

Approximately 144 hours of classroom training are required each year to complete the program. This is broken up into three terms of one class per term. All classes are held at Lane Community College.

WAGE SCHEDULE

Apprentice wages are based upon the average wage for journey workers employed by participating training employers. Apprentices are paid a progressive percentage of that average journey wage as follows:

1st	1,000 hour period	55% of average wage
2nd	1,000 hour period	60% of average wage
3rd	1,000 hour period	65% of average wage
4th	1,000 hour period	70% of average wage
5th	1,000 hour period	76% of average wage
6th	1,000 hour period	82% of average wage
7th	1,000 hour period	88% of average wage
8th	1,000 hour period	95% of average wage
