The Hearing

This hearing will be a continuation of the hearing held by the Board on February 13, 2013. The purpose of this hearing is to allow the Grant County District Attorney to make a statement on behalf of the committing jurisdiction. The Board will also be considering written submissions received by our office since the last hearing that relate to the subject matter of this hearing. The Board will allow the inmate to respond to statements made at the hearing and any new information. The Board will then close the record.

A Board decision on the matter will be issued in writing after sufficient time to deliberate. This could be one to several weeks, depending on the information presented.

The Record

- The material that was part of the “Board packet” for the last hearing
 - Board file documents relevant to this hearing including the presentence investigation
 - Submissions by the inmate
- The transcript from the information gathering portion of the February hearing.
- Letters received by the Board since the last hearing regarding the release of Mr. Porter.
 - The Board received numerous letters from stakeholders and the public on this matter. Those letters are a part of the record before the Board and will be considered in deliberations. Duplicative letters will be noted but not physically in the record.
 - If you previously sent a letter to the Board, there is no need to re-send it.
- Additional submissions
 - Per Board rules, relevant documents sent to the Board more than seven days before the hearing become part of the hearing packet. Materials sent less than seven days before the hearing will not be accepted. Because of the logistical constraints of this hearing, the Board requests that any written materials be submitted by **September 16, 2013.**
 - Please note that submissions to the Board are public record.

Attending the Hearing

Board hearings are open and members of the public can attend. There are, however, strict limitations on space due to facilities and security. Additionally, like all Board hearings, the hearing will be held in a correctional facility and certain security procedures must be followed. Seats for this hearing will be on a first-come, first-served basis.

Please submit your request by September 16, 2013. Late requests will not be considered.

Once the Board has reviewed the volume of requests received, those who have been allotted a seat will be notified and will be put on an attendance list. Only those who have made arrangements to attend will be allowed in the facility.

Please note that the Department of Corrections has rules for facility visitors. Visitors will be asked to arrive between specific times to proceed through security before the hearing.

- All attendees will go through the Department of Corrections security check. Information about security procedures will be available closer to the hearing date.
- Visitors will be asked to arrive early for the hearing and will be directed when to arrive.
- Outside food and drink will not be allowed. Please take this into account when preparing to attend the hearing.

If you have special needs or require accommodation, please let us know when making your request to attend.

After many attempts to arrange them, the Board regretfully found that live video feed and a satellite viewing location are not possible due to technological and logistical constraints. Information will be available after the hearing for those unable to attend.
