Updates on last meeting:

- 1) The next meeting will be June 26th in Newport.
- 2) Rod Rosenkranz from DMV gave a presentation on the DMV's efforts to enact the Federal Real ID act and SB 640.
- 3) Anna and Mike updated the committee on work being done by CJC (Drug Court Grants, SB 919 workgroup, the state-issued ID Task Force and the various Meth TF workgroups.
- 4) The Committee was shown copies of the new Meth Community Action Guide/Toolkit that Oregon Partnership has created with a grant from the CJC.
- 5) The committee suggested that the next state-wide LPSCC conference be held in Eugene. Mike will contact Lane County LPSCC to explore this.
- 6) A request was made that Craig Prins from the CJC attend the next meeting to give an update on criminal law changes which will take effect on July 1st.
- 7) A discussion was held on how LPSCCs function (serve as independent advisory groups or only as advisors to their respective Board of Commissioners). Bernice Barnett will follow up on this.

- 8) A suggestion was made that CJC set up an online LPSCC discussion or chat room. CJC will explore this possibility.
- 9) A suggestion was made that to help the process of determining which public safety policy issues are important that the CJC contact LPSCCs and ask for a prioritized 'wish list' of things that would help improve public safety in Oregon.
