Overview

The Psychiatric Security Review Board is in charge of people who have committed a crime and were found guilty except for insanity. These people are committed to the Oregon State Hospital, or are conditionally released to the community. The Board conducts hearings to decide the best place for these people. The Board may revoke a conditional release and order a person's return to the Oregon State Hospital. It may also discharge people from the Board's control. The Board currently has responsibility for about 348 persons at the Oregon State Hospital. It also oversees about 245 persons on conditional release in the community.

Balanced Budget

The Governor's balanced budget for the Psychiatric Security Review Board is \$795,770 total funds. This is a 13.6 percent increase over the 2001-03 Legislatively Approved Budget through the Fifth Special Session. The balanced budget maintains the agency's core programs, but reduces the budget to account for Services and Supplies savings that occurred during 2001-03.

Revenue

The Board's work is financed with General Fund. Other Funds expenditure limitation is for staff and Board member training. This is funded with money left over from an earlier award from the American Psychiatric Association.
