

OGEOF Meeting Notes

April 8, 1998

Meeting Summary

The OGEOF meeting was held at Labor and Industries on April 8th, 1998. The meeting addressed two main issues: reports from the various committees and a Vision and Mission statement for OGEOF. Members of the taxlot committee attended the meeting due to a scheduling conflict.

Committee Status Reports

Taxlot Committee

The taxlot committee began by informing OGEOF that the department of Revenue is taking over administrative and technical support roles. The taxlot committee's technical group completed a CD combining taxlots from multiple sources. They will continue to work on tightening up the structure used to combine datasets. Dean Anderson closed the report by mentioning that the taxlot policy group would be meeting with the Assistant Director of the Department of Revenue.

Hydrologic Committee

Bob Harmon reported that the hydrologic group had formed three subgroups, one for policy, one for watershed boundaries and one for attributes. The main focus of the watershed subgroup is delineating 1:24,000 scale fifth field watersheds for the eastern side of the state. The fifth field watershed may be finished within three to six months. OWRD is beginning work on the sixth field watersheds. The attributes committee has completed a preliminary list of attributes. This list is being circulated among various user groups. Bob finished his report by mentioning that the BLM is working on attributing and densifying streams on their lands.

Oregon Terrain Information System Committee (OTIS)

Nancy Tubbs reported for committee chair Emmor Nile who was unable to attend the meeting. OTIS has determined that the 30-meter DEMs are not usable for a number of users. They are attempting to acquire 10 meter DEMs. Money from various sources is being coordinated in order to maximize the number of quads created. In order to prevent different groups from creating incompatible 10 meter DEMs, Nancy Tubbs from USGS has worked up a contract that people can funnel money through. Otis is taking special efforts to ensure that all 10 meter DEMs have drainage enforcement and can be edgematched no matter who pays for them.

Orbits Committee

The orbits committee reported that they were continuing work on a transportation layer combining roads from multiple counties for a presentation to be given at the GIS in Action conference.

Mission Statement

In reply to questions asked by committees, OGEOF decided to create a Mission Statement and goals. After discussion it was decided that Dean Anderson would create a mission statement based on the OGIC and National Framework Mission statements. Dean was instructed to bring the mission statement to the next meeting for discussion. OGEOF agreed to the following six goals:

1. Explain Baseline97: what it is and what it is not.
2. Clean up baseline97 to meet a temporary standard.
3. Establish definitions of what the final baseline standard data will be.
4. Move Data to new format.
5. Determine long-term data maintenance and updating responsibilities.
6. Integrate better data into the framework dataset as it becomes available.
