| | The next NAIP orthoimagery project will begin this summer. The selected contractor is Aerial Services Inc. and will be at the ½ meter resolution and include the false-color infrared band. | | | |

Department Reports

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| DOGAMI- | The new statewide geology map with 19 mapping units should be completed by this summer. DOGAMI is working on a pilot project with FEMA in Coos County to update the DFIRM flood lines. |
| OWEB- | Working to digitize restoration projects. OWEB is migrating to server technology from ESRI and tracking potential stimulus projects (application s submitted for federal funding). |

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| DEQ- | Due to legislative mandate the effluent outfall tracking system lost funding and they are changing their priorities. |
| OWRD- | The Hydro Framework team meeting is scheduled for the end of April to discuss the migration to NHD. OWRD is utilizing Crossloop software to provide training and technical support to remote offices. |
| DOR- | ORMAP statewide taxlot compilation was easier this year due to cleaner data. There are 1,740,950 taxlots in the state. A tax collector database including situs is being investigated for GIS use. |
| ODA- | Funding cutbacks have led to changing priorities. ODA is developing a layer of high risk food safety areas for an upcoming Tsunami exercise. |
| DHS- | Construction of a public schools layer is 2/3 complete. The layer includes district boundaries, attendance boundaries, and ESD's. DHS is building a vulnerable population database. |
| OMD- | OMD is working to coordinate information about agencies' emergency response plans and capabilities. |
| DLCD- | Some counties are losing their GIS capabilities due to budget shortages. This leads to challenges to get local data. An update to the UGB layer should be completed this summer. |
| ODF- | ODF recently pushed the ArcGIS 9.3 update out to +/- 300 computers across the agency using Group Policy. Some on-line services are being developed to enable data construction. The ESRI License Tracker utility is continuing to evolve. |
| ODFW- | Published fish habitat data sets on the GEO website. Continuing to work on the fish passage barrier layer. |
| DSL- | Left early |
| ODOT- | Absent |

| OED- | Absent |
| GNIS- | Bill Clingman from LCOG gave a presentation about the GNIS and the National Structures Dataset. Volunteers are needed to become stewards of portions of this data. Bill will be setting up a meeting of this Framework team within the next two months. |
