<b>Agriculture</b>	Continuing work with food safety and the estuary maps. Applying for federal grant money for animal health. Have started working with Animal Health on two projects – 1) poultry; and 2) feed lot problems. Riparian group survey has had dollars pulled. DEQ has issued 319 grants. Low flight pilots include the North Coast, Yamhill and Deschutes counties to monitor vegetation and Agricultural area changes.		No	
<b>OWEB</b>	Basin prototype for NRIS. Budget issues holding up coordination efforts. Internal database being worked on in response to federal mandate changes.		No

<b>Water Resources</b>	Will be moving soon; budget is approved. No general funds available for water rights mapping, will be looking for external dollars.		No	
<b>Geology</b>	Pilot project for NE Oregon compilation will require numerous raster-to-vector conversions. Geologic data content and structure being discussed by DOGAMI field mapping staff (in coordination with FIT Geoscience workgroup). Clackamas County earthquake study is due for release in the fall. <b>ODOT</b>	Environmental Data Management System for Southwestern Oregon for State Highways completed. Salmon project should be completed by end of biennium. The all roads and transportation project management ends June 30 <sup>th</sup> . Wasco County is complete, Clatsop roads – 10k loaded and into the test database. Working on data for Douglas and Umatilla Counties. Has a project proposal with the State of Washington for planning and research. The tourist map is completed and ready for distribution – includes many GIS layers this is a free to the public map. ODOT also has an interactive visual database for review. ODOT is shedding positions with no replacements at this time.		No	
<b>DEQ</b>	Municipal watershed layer will be completed by the end of June; working on firefighting issues. Internally they are revamping GIS Data Server – should be completed in a couple of months		No	
<b>Forestry</b>	Showed a hard copy of the public lands /ownership map. Closing in on the polygon layer and attribute cleanup. Not anticipating adjustments at this point. Currently preparing for fire season. Continuing to hone individual Data Theme Standards. Still hopeful of position approval.		No
