ODA	There have been cases of Sudden Oak Death detected in Brookings and in a nursery in Clackamas County. The traps for gypsy moth are being set out. Trap maps for placing traps for the summer season are available. Maps for the Gypsy Moth Spray project going on this week. Working on Mapping T&E fish on private ag land and Estuary mapping of water sample sites for shellfish program in Food Safety Creation (SWCD Soil and Water conservation districts) zone maps.			
ODEQ	2002 -2003 data list was approved at the end of March. Municipal watersheds are being updated – the latest version will be posted to the Clearinghouse web site. Emmor requests that they be made available before fire season.

OWEB	Presentation of the Natural Resource Information System will be made to the Board later this week. A user survey was sent out to watershed council (WSC) and soil and water conservation district (SWCD) members to gather information to help in shaping the information system for the Oregon Plan. Survey results have been compiled from the WSC responses. Many of the data priorities for the watershed councils in the State relate to Framework data in development. Janine will end her employment as of June 30 th and Doug's position may be in jeopardy. North Coast basin portal prototype planning and design is progressing and a RFP issuance may ask for alternative design process.
