DAS/OGIC update	<p>Cy Smith mentioned the 4 main items discussed at the OGIC meeting in September. They were:</p> <p>1) Disclaimers – ODOT’s initial minimal data disclaimer was determined to be insufficient for the intended use. This will be re-addressed with the Attorney General’s office prior to the next OGIC meeting and re-presented.</p> <p>2) Confidentiality – Oregon Employment Dept. presented a basic outline of the issue to OGIC. Most legacy data within the Human Services agencies can be address matched, but this involves a new understanding about the sharing of information about people and places. An example (archaeological sites being prepared by the State Historical Preservation Office – SHPO) was raised as an illustration. We need to be thinking about ways to “allow” data sharing (rather than looking to “require” it).</p> <p>3) GIS Certification – OGIC moved that the committee looking at this issue recommend a program that would allow for voluntary</p>			

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	<p>GIS certification to occur in Oregon.</p> <p>4) Public Safety (NSGIC initiative) – This effort to draw national attention to the importance and value of GIS data for Public Safety was presented to OGIC in the hope that they would sign/endorse it. John Lattimer (State CIO and OGIC chair) was directed to present the document to the Governor's Office for consideration.</p> <p>The Dept. of Forestry server that currently houses the DOQs is going to be replaced.</p>	The DOQs will be moved over from DOF to OGDC. Pixxures update	Seven counties have placed orders for 2000 DOQ processing, and two more are anticipated. 47 quads have been ordered to fill in holes in and around existing orders, using OGIC funds authorized for orthoimagery.
