What is *internOregon*?

The *internOregon* program is an opportunity for you to gain valuable, meaningful experience that will help you further your career and educational goals. Submit an application and we will work diligently to find an internship opportunity that you will find intriguing, exciting, and a valuable tool for your future. If selected you will be responsible for working with your supervisor to plan and complete a project over the summer. The internship concludes with a *Project Presentation* at which time you will have the opportunity to present your accomplishments to a group of state government leaders.

Paid!

The hourly rate you will receive if selected will correlate with the year you are in college and is expected to range from \$12-\$18/hour (the hourly rate will be finalized by 3/15/08). To qualify you must have completed a minimum of 90 credit hours/60 semester hours before June 16th, possess a minimum GPA of 2.5, and be authorized to work in the United States. Interns will be classified as unrepresented temporary employees of DAS and are not eligible for overtime or health benefits. Some of the internships may require an extensive background check, fingerprinting and/or valid drivers' license.
