What is *internOregon*?

The *internOregon* program is an opportunity for you to gain valuable, meaningful experience that will help you further your career and educational goals. Submit an application and we will work diligently to find an internship opportunity that you will find intriguing, exciting, and a valuable tool for your future. If selected you will be responsible for working with your supervisor to plan, further and in most cases complete a project.

Paid!

Your hourly rate will correlate with the year you have completed in college prior to entering the program. The pay range is from \$12-\$15.50 per hour. Our focus will be to place applicants who possess a minimum of 90 credit quarter hours or 60 credit semester hours before the start of their internship, who possess a minimum GPA of 2.5, and are authorized to work in the United States. Interns are classified as unrepresented temporary employees of the state of Oregon and are not eligible for health benefits. Some internships may require an extensive background check, fingerprinting and/or valid drivers' license.
