Workers' Compensation Claims Characteristics Calendar Year 2018

The Workers' Compensation Division received notification of 21,008 accepted disabling claims in 2018. Employment increased by 37,200 workers and claims increased by 22 from 2017, resulting in a 2018 claims rate of 1.1 claims per 100 workers.



In 2018, there were 71 years separating the oldest and youngest workers. The youngest was a 14-year-old farm worker whose feet were run over leading to contusions on both feet. The oldest was an 85-year-old retail worker who suffered a lumbar strain after placing a heavy item in a box.


There were 4,053 accepted disabling claims for falls in 2018. Approximately 73 percent resulted in either sprains, strains, or tears (2,056) or fractures (913).


Bodily condition and/or motion incidents are cases where workers themselves are the primary source of injury or illness, such as a worker twisting his/her back when reaching for something. These events most commonly result in sprains or strains (approximately 67 percent).

INJURY/DISEASE FACTS, OREGON, 2018

- Private industry accounted for 18,446 of the accepted disabling claims (87.8 percent).
- The most commonly injured worker occupation was transportation and material movers.
 Combined, these categories comprised approximately 30 percent of all accepted disabling claims in 2018.
- Occupational diseases comprised 5.1 percent of the accepted disabling claims.
- Workers in their first year with an employer filed 6,805 claims, 32.4 percent of the total accepted disabling claims in 2018, compared to 2,222 (10.6 percent) for those in their second year.
- Of the total 21,008 accepted disabling claims, 110 were for workers younger than age 18, and 843 were for workers age 65 or older. The average age of claimants in 2018 was 42.
- Most of the claims were for male workers, accounting for 13,256 (63.1 percent) of the total compared to 7,752 (36.9 percent) for females.
- The median weekly wage at time of injury for all claimants was \$670.00 compared to \$778.40 for all Oregon workers, excluding federal employees.
- Of the total 21,008 claims, 2.0 percent (428) occurred out of state.
