OHP Prioritized List of Health Services

The Prioritized List of Health Services was created and is still maintained by Oregon's Health Services Commission. In general, services that help prevent an illness are ranked above those services that treat the illness after it occurs. Services prioritized low on the list are for conditions that (a) get better on their own or for which a home remedy is just as effective, such as the common cold, (b) are primarily cosmetic in nature, such as benign skin lesions, or (c) have no effective treatments available, such as metastatic cancer.

The excerpts below contain the line number, diagnosis, and as necessary, a description of the diagnosis in non-medical language. OHP Medicaid and CHIP benefit packages currently cover condition/treatment pairs from Line 1 through 546 of 730 lines in the October 2004 modified Prioritized List.

Line 548

Diagnosis: CERUMEN IMPACTION, FOREIGN BODY IN EAR & NOSE
(Removal of foreign body from ear or nose, may include wax removal)

Line 547

Diagnosis: ACUTE CONJUNCTIVITIS (Newly diagnosed eye infection)

Line 546

Diagnosis: CHRONIC OTITIS MEDIA (Long-term [Chronic] inner ear infection with treatment including adenoidectomy and "tubes" in the ear)

Line 545

Diagnosis: CHRONIC ANAL FISSURE (a split or furrow in the anus requiring surgical treatment)

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Line 544

Diagnosis: BALANOPOSTHITIS (penile foreskin inflammation)

Line 543

Diagnosis: VAGINITIS, TRICHOMONIASIS (vaginal infections, including yeast infection)

Line 542

Diagnosis: THROMBOSED & COMPLICATED HEMORRHOIDS
(varicose veins of the rectal sphincter with blood clot)

Line 541

Diagnosis: URETHRAL FISTULA (Abnormal opening into bladder canal)

Line 540

Diagnosis: BENIGN NEOPLASM of KIDNEY & OTHER URINARY
ORGANS (kidney or other urinary system tumor – noncancerous)

Line 539

Diagnosis: RECTAL PROLAPSE (protruding rectum)

Line 538

Diagnosis: FECAL INCONTINENCE (bowel movement incontinence)
