Opiate & Prescription Medication Abuse Eric Martin, ACCBO, Joseph Galligan, Hazelden Springbrook, Dr. Michael Price, BestCare, Dr. Vern Williams, Hazelden Springbrook	Heather introduced the panel. Topic: Very severe problem with prescription pain medication and how this has replaced meth. Meth use has been going down since 2002. Eric Martin presented a Power Point presentation showing State and National trends in abuse. Explained that Oregon ranks 3 rd in the nation for age 26+ and 4 th for youth. 60% of prescription drug abuse is in the U.S. Of these, 90% is Vicadin (#2 most abused drug for kids after alcohol-they perceive it as "safer" because it's from a doctor); 80% opiates. Need to put a greater investment in treatment. Opiates are used for chronic pain treatment, however, the panel reported that after opiate receptors have healed, the pain goes away; users don't realize that pain is a symptom of opioid withdrawal. Standards of practice for medication replacement needs to be set; relationship between doctors and pharmaceutical suppliers needs to improve; problem is perpetuated by suppliers not taking responsibility. Williams and Price to testify on the pharmacy bill before the legislature. Williams suggested 9 hours of education
