Introductions, Review of Agenda & Minutes

Introductions completed and the June stakeholder minutes were approved. Bob Miller announced new name for OMHAS: Addictions and Mental Health Division (AMH).

Inventory - Survey

Jon Collins provided an overview of the April 2006 EBP inventory results (handout) and next steps. Highlights and stakeholder questions/comments:

- 132 unique providers responded
- In order to have a more accurate/complete picture of EBP use statewide, AMH will distribute the information received so far (to each county) with a request for any corrections/additions to the information.

- Are prison-based programs included in the data? – Jon will follow-up.
- Suggestion to show number of providers available in each county.
- Explain practice descriptions: “not approved” and “not recognized.”
- Could this data be tracked by diagnosis type? – Yes, it could be done that way.
- AMH requested that stakeholders pass along to their colleagues our goal to obtain a more complete statewide picture, and to encourage response to the follow-up “inventory survey.”
- Request that the follow-up survey be sent electronically.
- Will an annual EBP report be required from providers? The report will likely be requested in early 2007.
- Data elements:
 - The sooner they are determined/provided, the better the data will be.
 - Proposed elements: number, cost, outcomes and/or fidelity.
 - Will the data be requested from providers, CMHPs or MHOs?: Providers.
 - Need to be very clear when requesting data from the field.
- Follow-up inventory survey: need to provide specific instructions.
- Draft survey will be on December 12 stakeholder agenda and distributed to stakeholder group via email prior to the meeting.

Oregon Administrative Rules (OARs)

Len Ray provided an update of the OAR revision process currently underway.

- Rick Luthe has been hired as the AMH rules coordinator.
- Draft rule structure document distributed and discussed.
- Site reviews are currently suspended to redirect staff efforts toward rule revision.
- Steering committee has been established and meets weekly.
- Goals:
 - eliminate redundancy;
 - limit documentation;
 - promote recovery, EBPs and outcomes; and
 - provide consistency in site review process.
- We are changing the structure, not just the text of the rules.
- Addiction and Mental Health reviews – should they be conducted jointly or separately?
- Product desired by the end of 2006 – draft document will be produced.
- Comment: the steering committee is a very well-run and effective meeting.
- Other states rules are being researched: Illinois, Connecticut and others.
Request to include this research in the draft document.

- Request for more specificity of “child” reference in rules.
- Acknowledge efforts done in the state for specific populations.
- “Letter of the law” versus “spirit of the law” i.e., quality of care, client-directed treatment.

Measuring Progress: Judiciary Report

Bob Miller shared that Bob Nikkel will report to the Interim Joint Judiciary Committee on September 20. Bottom line: EBP has become the main focus of the field and the 25% requirement has been met and exceeded. The report will be posted on the AMH Web site following the presentation.

Other agencies included in the presentation will be: Department of Corrections, Oregon Youth Authority, Oregon criminal Justice Commission and Commission on Children and Families.

The document will be reviewed by AMH EBP Steering Committee, Interagency Steering Committee and approved by Bob Nikkel. Final document will be posted on our Web site.
