Agenda items for the full commission include public testimony (10:15 a.m.), budget update (10:20 a.m.), HUBB update (10:30 a.m.), STEPS update (10:45 a.m.), training update (11 a.m.), registry update (11:15 p.m.), workers' compensation update (11:30 a.m.), executive session (12 p.m.) and executive director's report (1 p.m.). The executive session (ORS 192.610-192.710) will be held to discuss labor negotiations with the governing body's representative. ORS 192.660(1)(d).

The commission is responsible for ensuring the quality of publicly funded in-home care services. The commission has three major charges: (1) to define qualifications of homecare workers; (2) to create a statewide registry of homecare workers; and (3) to provide training opportunities for homecare workers. Beyond these responsibilities, the Home Care Commission is also the "employer of record" for purposes of collective bargaining for homecare workers whose pay comes from public funds.
