



CROSS CONNECTION SPECIALIST CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

HEALTH SERVICES

CROSS CONNECTION / BACKFLOW PREVENTION PROGRAM

Requirements for New Applicants

The following requirements must be met in order to qualify for Cross Connection Specialist (previously titled “Cross Connection Inspector”) certification:

- ❑ Successful completion at a DHS-approved Cross Connection Specialist initial training and testing source within 12 months prior to the Department receiving the completed application that includes:
 1. Attendance at the class for 30 hours of training.
 2. A minimum score of 85% on the written examination.
- ❑ A Construction Contractor’s Board or Landscape Contractor’s Board license may be required if you provide Cross Connection Specialist services for a fee. These requirements are defined under Oregon Revised Statutes 448.279(2).
- ❑ Submission of proof of high school graduation or equivalent.
- ❑ Submission of documentation of 1-year of experience in water systems or plumbing.
- ❑ Submission of a **completed** and **signed** new applicant form including all required documentation and initial application fee payment of \$70.00 (prorated to \$35.00 in the last half of a certification cycle, see “About the Certification Program” below).

Ongoing Requirements for Renewal Applicants

Individual renewal forms will be mailed to those currently certified prior to the end of the renewal period, June 30 of every odd numbered year. The following requirements must be met in order to maintain your Cross Connection Specialist certification:

- ❑ Successful completion at a DHS-approved Cross Connection Specialist training and testing course for 0.6 Continuing Education Units (CEU) **or** obtain a total of at least 0.6 CEU related to cross connection control, within the prior 2-year certification period. If the 0.6 CEU are obtained from sources other than a DHS-approved training and testing agency, the content must be Oregon Environmental Services Advisory Council (OESAC)-approved for training related to cross connection control.
- ❑ A Construction Contractor’s Board or Landscape Contractor’s Board license may be required if you provide Cross Connection Specialist services for a fee. These requirements are defined under Oregon Revised Statutes 448.279(2).
- ❑ Submission of a **completed** and **signed** renewal application form including all required documentation and the renewal application fee payment of \$70.00 (see “Lapsed Certificates” and “About the Certification Program” below).

Reciprocity Requirements

DHS may issue a Cross Connection Specialist certificate based on reciprocity if the issuing state or entity has standards and qualifications that are equivalent to DHS standards and qualifications and the following requirements are met in order to qualify for Oregon Cross Connection Specialist certification:

- ❑ Submission of current certification as a Cross Connection Specialist from another state or entity.
- ❑ Successful completion at a DHS-approved Oregon Cross Connection Specialist re-certification training course for the required 0.6 CEU within 12 months prior to the Department receiving the completed reciprocity application.
- ❑ A Construction Contractor’s Board or Landscape Contractor’s Board license may be required if you provide Cross Connection Specialist services for a fee. These requirements are defined under Oregon Revised Statutes 448.279(2).
- ❑ Submission of proof of high school graduation or equivalent.

- ❑ Submission of a **completed** and **signed** reciprocity application form including all required documentation and reciprocity application fee payment of \$105.00 (prorated to \$70.00 in the last half of a certification cycle, see “About the Certification Program” below).

Lapsed Certificates << This pertains to renewal applicants only>>

A certification that has lapsed for **fewer than 30 days** may be reinstated by meeting the normal renewal requirements.

A certification that has lapsed **for more than 30 days but less than 1 year** may be reinstated by meeting the normal renewal requirements and paying a \$50.00 reinstatement fee in addition to the \$70.00 renewal fee (\$120.00 total).

A certification that has lapsed **for more than 1 year** may be reinstated by meeting all the requirements for a new applicant (this includes re-taking the 30-hour class) and paying a \$50.00 reinstatement fee in addition to the \$70.00 renewal fee (\$120.00 total).

About the Certification Program

The Department issues certification cards on a 2-year certification cycle. **ALL cards expire on June 30 of odd numbered years.** New applicants may receive cards that expire less than two years from the issue date, depending on when they apply. The certification fee will be prorated to \$35.00 for applications received in the last half (after June 30 in even numbered years) of a 2-year certification cycle.

Renewal applications will be mailed in late April of odd numbered years to the address provided by the applicant. *It is the applicant's responsibility to notify the Department of name, employer, address, phone or CCB/LCB licensure changes.*
