INTER-HOSPITAL TRANSFER CRITERIA

CENTRAL NERVOUS SYSTEM	→	Head Injury: Penetrating injury Depressed skull fracture Open injury CSF leak Deterioration in GCS 2 or more points Lateralizing signs Spinal Cord Injury: Major vertebral injury Spinal cord injury
CHEST	→	Wide superior mediastinum Major chest wall injury or pulmonary contusion Cardiac injury Patients who require protracted ventilation
PELVIS	→	Unstable pelvic ring disruption Pelvic fracture with shock Evidence of continued hemorrhage Open pelvic injury
MULTIPLE SYSTEM INJURY	→	Head injury combined with significant face, chest, abdominal, or pelvic injury Burns with associated injuries Multiple long-bone (humerus/femur) fractures Significant injury to more than two body regions
SECONDARY DETERIORATION (LATE SEQUELAE)	→	Patients requiring long term ventilation Sepsis Single or multiple organ system failure (deterioration in CNS, cardiac, pulmonary, hepatic, renal or coagulation systems) Major tissue necrosis
