Certificate of Need Update

The Certificate of Need process is the state's only regulatory mechanism aimed at controlling the development of new health care facilities and services. The purpose of the law is to see that health services are adequately distributed around the state without unnecessary duplication of services or excessive costs to patients.

Applications under Review

Cascade Manor, Eugene, proposes to relocate five nursing facility beds from Marquis Care at Springfield to its facility. On May 26, 2009, this project was ruled to be subject to full review under Certificate of Need law. The Department is evaluating whether this project is eligible for an expedited review.

Columbia Health District, St. Helens, proposes to establish a new 12-bed hospital in St. Helens. On July 24, 2009 this application was ruled to be complete and review began on July 25, 2009. The Department expects to make a written decision on the application by October 22, 2009. A public meeting was held on August 12, 2009 and a second public meeting will be held on September 28, 2009.



Decisions

East Cascade Retirement LLC, Wilsonville, was issued a proposed order on August 28, 2009, approving its proposal to relocate nursing facility beds from Mt. View Hospital to its campus in Madras.
