

# 2008 OPIC Awards



**Purpose:** To honor individuals or organizations which have significantly contributed to increasing childhood and/or adolescent immunization awareness and/or the rate of immunizations in Oregon. The 2008 awards honor recipients for 2007 activities.



**Categories:** Awards will honor recipients in the following categories:

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## **Individual Leadership**

An individual (volunteer or non-volunteer) who demonstrates outstanding leadership and dedication to immunization activities.

## **Innovative Partnership**

An innovative collaboration of two or more public/private organizations to successfully promote immunization activities.

## **Model Program**

A practice, project or program that demonstrates a commitment to increasing access to immunization services for communities of color.

## **Media and Promotion**

An organization that has contributed to broad community outreach, including television, radio and/or print ads, campaigns and programs.



## **Volunteer (organization)**

An organization that promotes highly successful immunization activities in a local community.

## **Immunization Provider**

An individual, or group of providers, in a clinical or educational setting who have demonstrated a commitment to increasing patient or student immunization levels through use of best practices, (i.e. participation in Oregon Immunization ALERT, Standards for Pediatric & Adolescent Immunization Practices, AFIX, etc.) or notable community outreach activities.

## **Public Health Organization**

A public health organization that has contributed significantly to increasing immunization awareness.

## **OPIC Champion**

An elected official who demonstrates leadership and dedication to immunization activities.
