

Program Element #21: Services to Victims of Sexual Offenses (OCADSV only)

- 1. Purpose of Program Element.** Services to Victims of Sexual Offenses are intended to provide financial and technical assistance to direct service providers as mandated by the Federal Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant.
- 2. Definitions Specific to this Agreement.**
 - a. Conference of Local Health Officials (CLHO):** means the Conference of Local Health Officials created by ORS 431.330.
 - b. Federal Funds:** means all funds paid to Grantee under this Public Health Financial Assistance Grant Agreement (the "Agreement") that Department receives from an agency, instrumentality or program of the federal government of the United States.
 - c. Financial Assistance Award (FAA):** means the description of financial assistance set forth in Exhibit C, as such Financial Assistance Award may be amended from time to time.
 - d. Medicaid:** means Federal Funds received by Department under Title XIX of the Social Security Act.
 - e. Program Element:** means the services as described in Exhibit B of the Agreement, whose costs are covered in whole or in part with financial assistance Department pays to Grantee pursuant to this Agreement:
 - f. Public Health Service Act:** Federal laws governing use of Federal funds awarded to states through block grants.
 - g. Program Element Description:** means the description of a Program Element as set forth in Exhibit B of the Agreement.
- 3. Description of Services.** The Oregon Coalition Against Domestic and Sexual Violence (OCADSV) provides technical assistance, on-site training and service coordination to twenty-eight (28) direct service providers. Services provided pursuant to this Agreement shall include:
 - a.** Crisis counseling, hospital accompaniment, support groups, individual counseling, support through the justice system, and referral to other sources,
 - b.** technical assistance to all Oregon counties in establishing community coordinated Sexual Assault Teams that consist of an advocate, law enforcement and medical professionals and other providers, and
 - c.** a 24 hour crisis line.
- 4. Reporting Obligations and Periodic Reporting Requirements**
 - a.** Grantee shall comply with the reporting obligations set forth in Exhibit C, Section 8., of the Agreement, with regard to the following schedule:

- i. Three (3) month Fiscal report for the time period of July 1, 2008 through September 30, 2008 is to be submitted to Department **no later than October 25, 2008**.
 - ii. Six (6) month Fiscal report for the time period of October 1, 2008 through December 31, 2008 is to be submitted to Department **no later than January 25, 2009**.
 - iii. Nine (9) month Fiscal report for the time period of January 1, 2009 through March 31, 2009 is to be submitted to Department **no later than April 25, 2009**.
 - iv. Twelve (12) month Fiscal report for the time period of April 1, 2009 through June 30, 2009 is to be submitted to Department **no later than August 25, 2009**.
- b. In addition, Grantee shall submit an annual progress report to Department as required by CDC. Format and due date will be provided by Department to Grantee in accordance with the instructions from CDC.

5. Performance Measures

- a. Majority of survivors leaving services will receive education, materials, advocacy services, and complete a safety plan.
- b. See a decrease in discrepancy between number of incidents of rape and the number of reported incidents leading to an overall decrease in number or actual or attempted rapes.

6. Other conditions. As a sub-recipient of Federal funds, Grantee must comply with the "State" requirements of the Public Health Service Act, Section 1904, (3)(b)(i-iv) herein recited for reference as follows:

- Excerpt of Public Health Service Act, Section 1904, (3)(b)(i-iv):

"[(3)] (b) A State may not use amounts paid to it under section 1903 to--

- i. provide inpatient services,
- ii. make cash payments to intended recipients of health services,
- iii. purchase or improve land, purchase, construct, or permanently improve (other than minor remodeling) any building or other facility, to purchase major medical equipment,
- iv. satisfy any requirements for the expenditure of non-Federal funds as a condition for the receipt of Federal funds, or
- v. provide financial assistance to any entity other than a public or nonprofit private entity.

Except as provided in subsection (a)(1)(E), the Secretary may waive the limitations contained in paragraph (3) upon the request of a State if the Secretary finds that there are extraordinary circumstances to justify the waiver and that granting the waiver will assist in carrying out this part."
