

**A Healthy Active Oregon: Statewide Physical Activity and Nutrition Plan 2007-2011
2009 Top Priority Objective by Setting**

Setting	Top Ranked Objective in Plan Survey	Percent of respondents who said they were currently working on this objective	Number of respondents who ranked objective as #1 for this setting
Built Environment	Objective I: By 2012, increase from baseline the number of state and local jurisdictions and communities with land use-planning, community design and transportation policies that support environments that encourage daily physical activity, healthy eating and healthy weight.	44%	N = 61 (of 74)
Worksite	Objective I: By 2012, increase by 10 percent the number of worksites with policies and programs that promote and support physical activity and healthy eating for employees and their family members.	46%	N = 40 (of 70)
Health Care System	Objective I: By 2012, to increase support for breastfeeding, 15 percent of Oregon birthing hospitals will achieve the World Health Organization designation of Baby-Friendly Hospital, meaning they are centers of breastfeeding support.	10%	N = 31 (of 69)
Schools and Child Care Settings	Objective I: By 2010, all school and child care settings will implement policies requiring all food to meet or exceed current USDA Dietary Guidelines for Americans and all serving sizes to be age appropriate.	26%	N = 35 (of 69)
Community	Objective III: By 2012, increase from baseline the number of communities implementing policies and environmental supports for physical activity and healthy eating.	26%	N = 31 (of 69)
Homes/ Households	Objective III: By 2012, increase by five percent the number of Oregon adults and children who met the recommendation for daily physical activity.	33%	N = 21 (of 67)

A few findings from the 74 survey respondents are:

- Every county had at least one respondent
- 21% of respondents said that they are involved in developing the plan (N=14)
- 57% of respondents said they are part of a community-based coalition working toward goals of the plan (N=36)
- Four of six objectives ranked #1 by setting include a specific reference to policy
