Telephone Town Hall on November 10th

If Alzheimer's disease has impacted your life in any way, your voice is important to us.

RSVP today to be part of a Telephone Town Hall meeting on Thursday, November 10th about what should be in a State Plan for Alzheimer's Disease in Oregon.

Your input is needed to help us craft a plan to address the escalating public health crisis caused by the growing number of individuals diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease and related dementias.

We already held six town hall meetings around Oregon, and we heard from hundreds of people impacted by Alzheimer's, but we know that many people who wanted to participate couldn't come to those events. That's why we are holding this **telephone town hall** so you can provide your input without leaving home or work.

The call will be from 1:00 PM to 2:30 PM on Thursday, November 10th.

You MUST RSVP for this call, as we will call you to participate.

For those without computers to RSVP online, call Jon Bartholomew at 503-416-0202 to be added to the RSVP list. You can also print out this flyer to hand to people or post on bulletin boards.

On November 10th, we will call you at 1:00 PM. If you are too busy to take the call, you can hang up or not answer, but if you can participate, you will be connected to hundreds of other Oregonians providing input on this plan.
