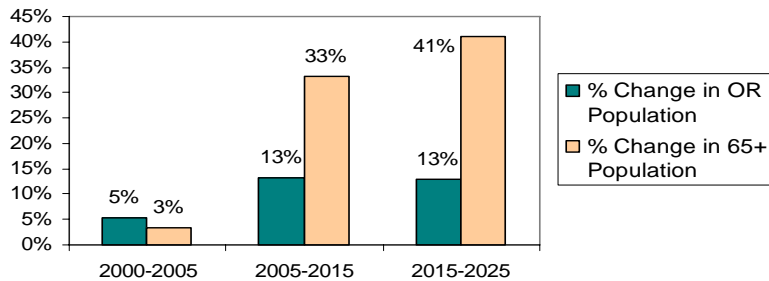

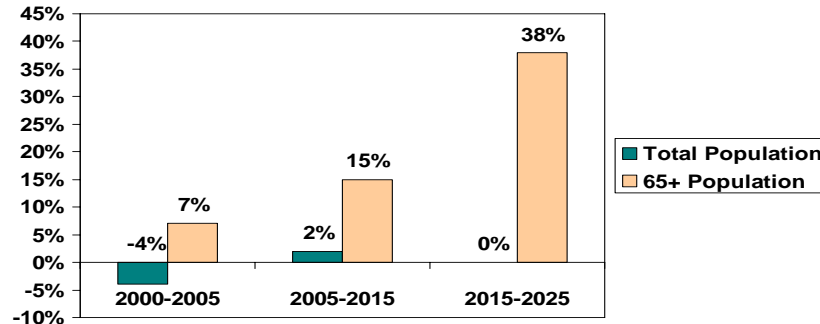

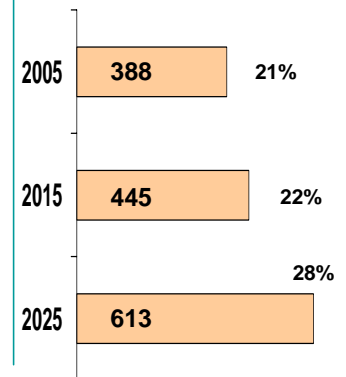
Growth Rate of Oregon's Aging Population



Growth Rate Of Gilliam County's Aging Population

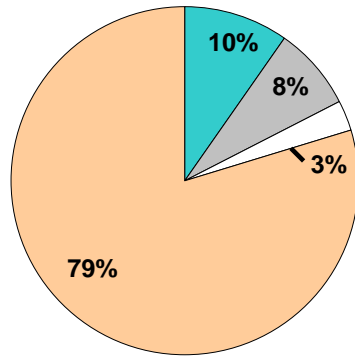


Gilliam County Projected 65+ Population and % of general population

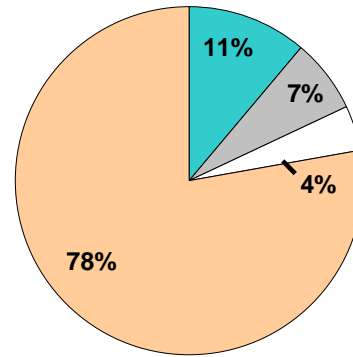

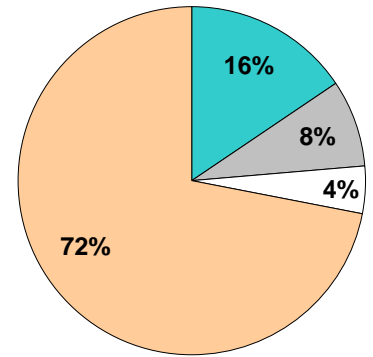

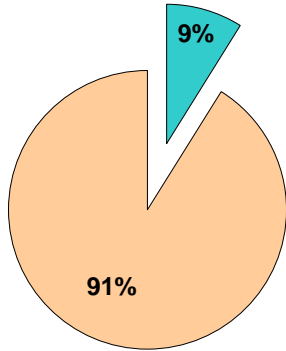

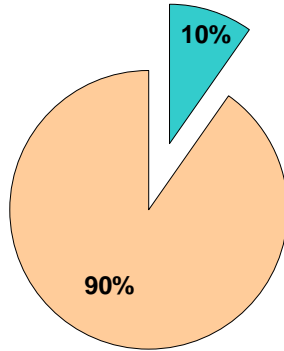

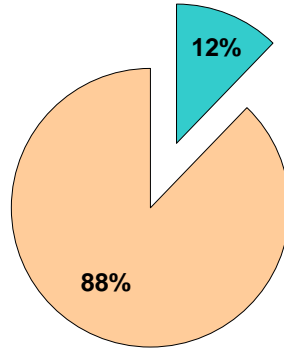

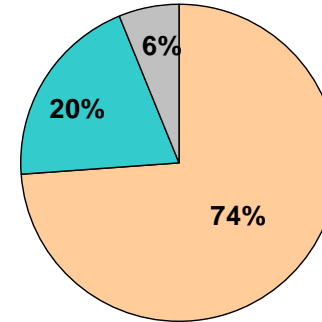

National % of Seniors Needing Assistance Due to Disability



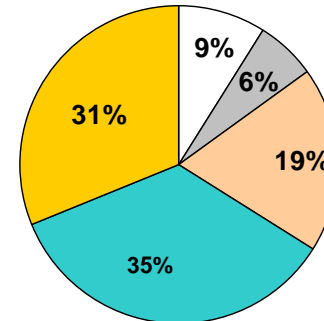

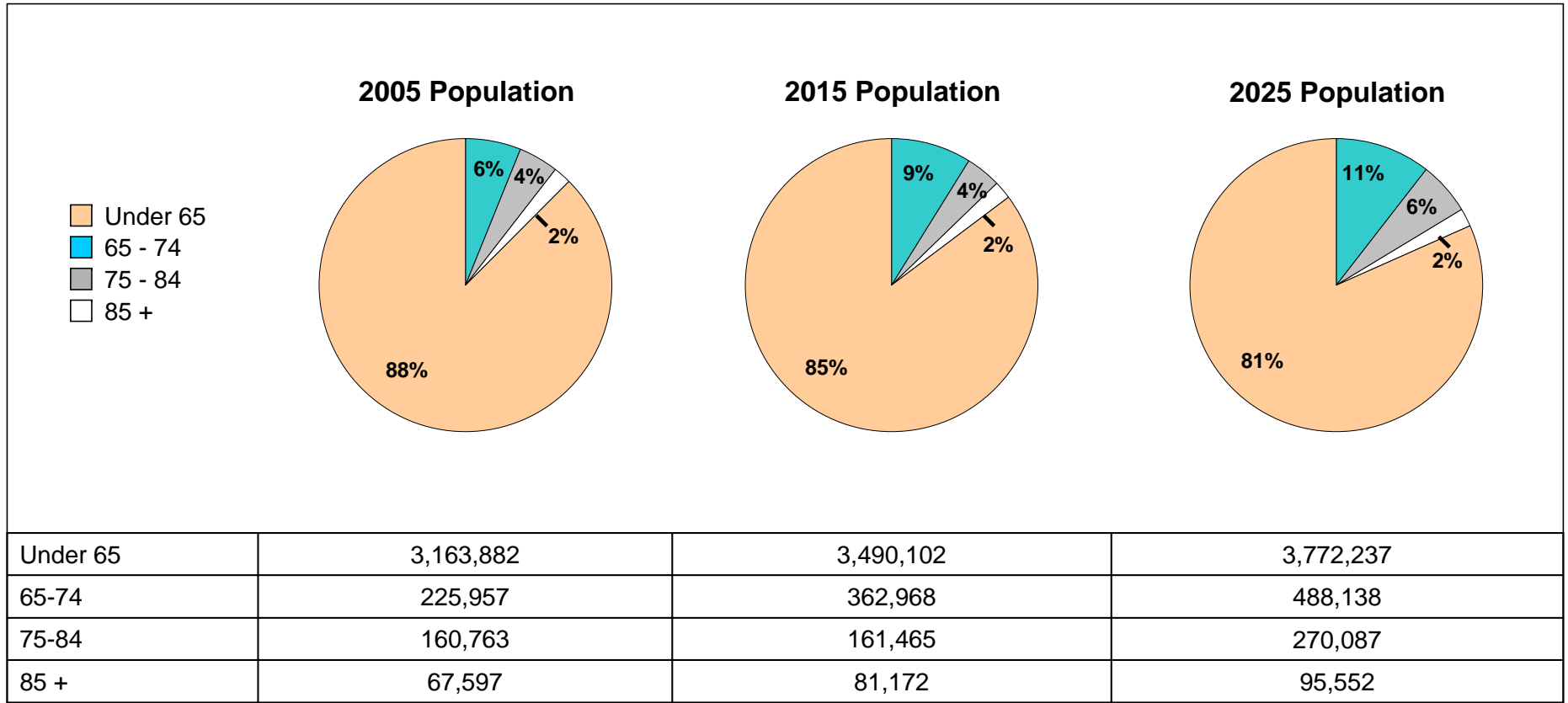
