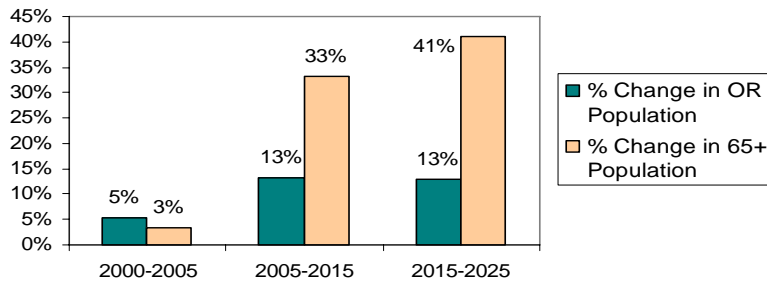

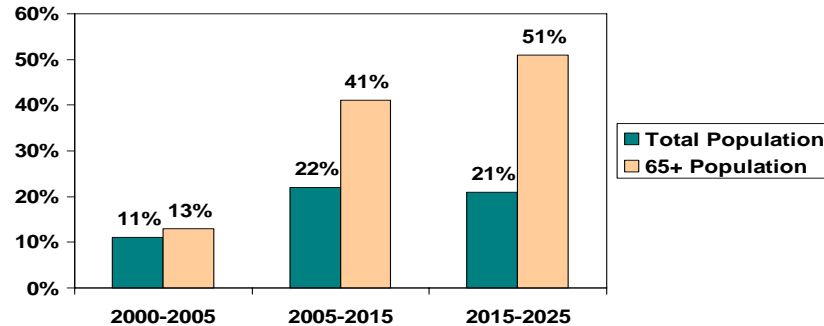

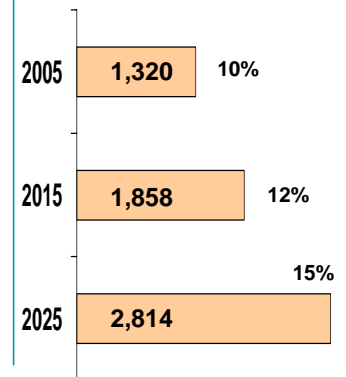
### Growth Rate of Oregon's Aging Population



### Growth Rate Of Morrow County's Aging Population

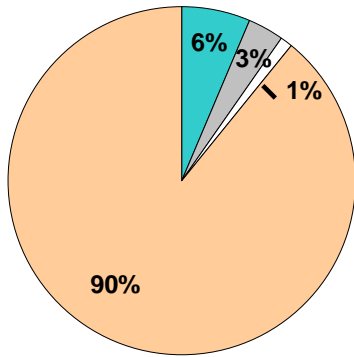


### Morrow County Projected 65+ Population and % of general population

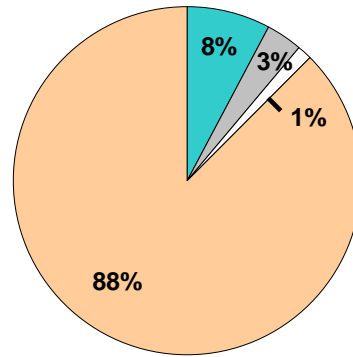

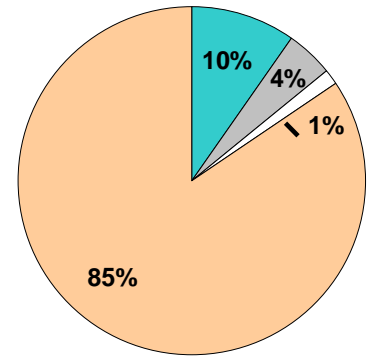

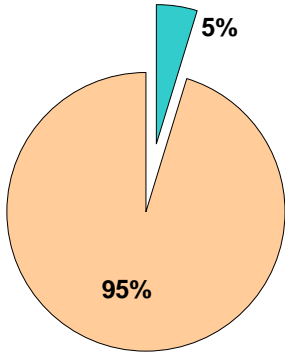

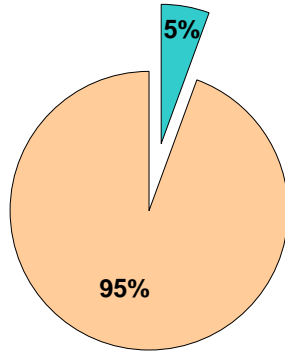

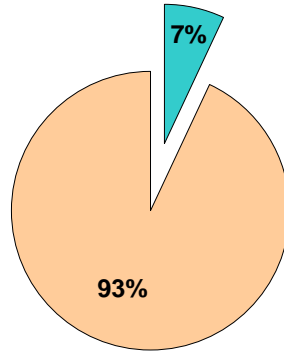

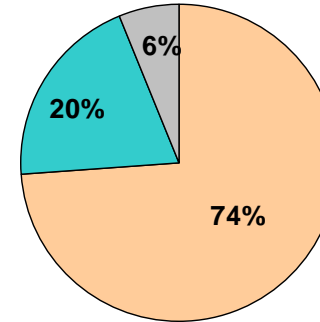

### National % of Seniors Needing Assistance Due to Disability



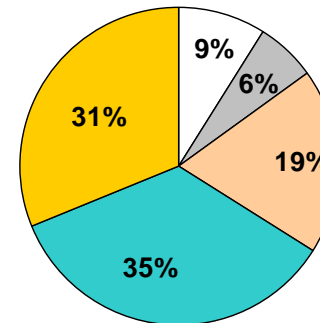
No Disabilities

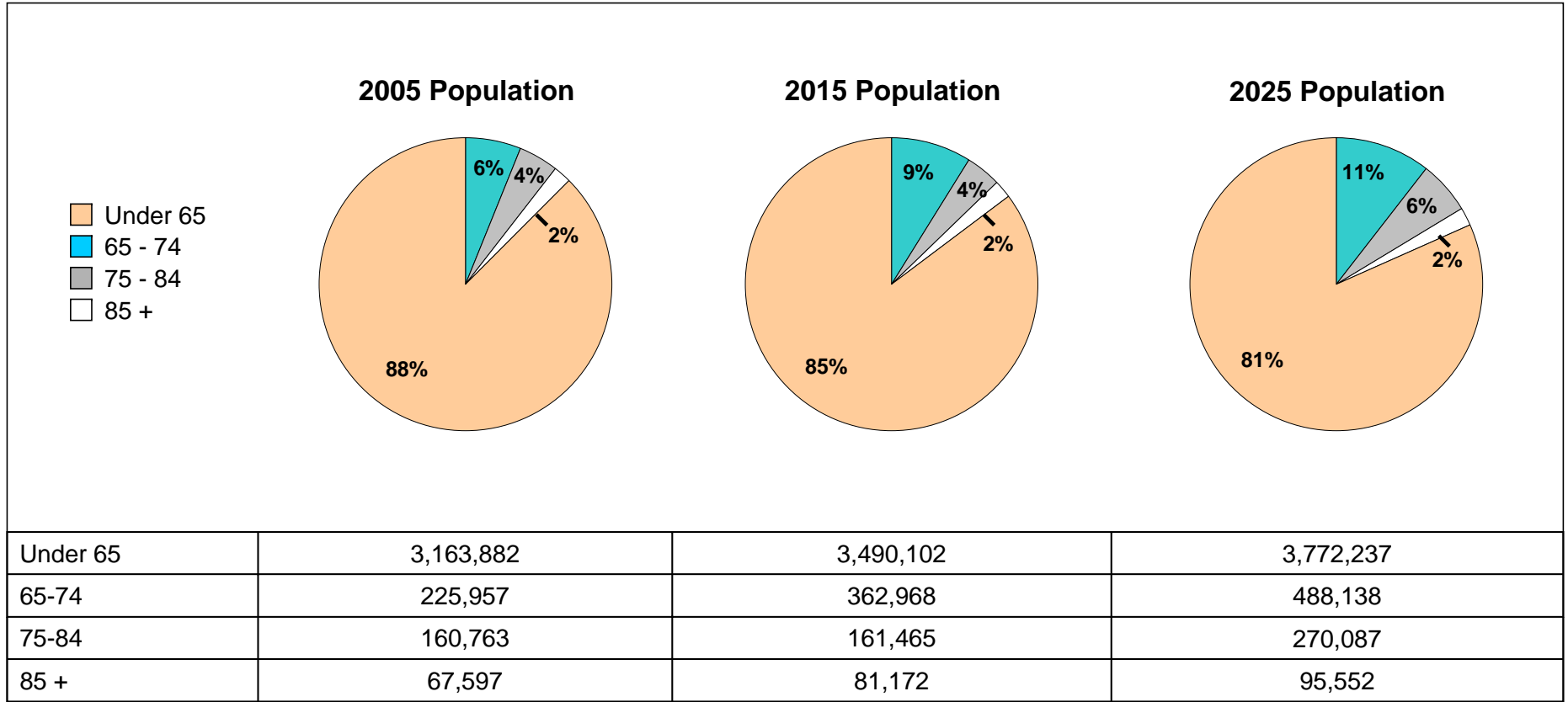
