SUBJECT: TRAINING FOR CORRECTIONAL OFFICERS

POLICY: A training program shall be established and approved for all correctional officers to be trained in the identification and emergency treatment in potentially life-threatening or serious medical conditions.

REFERENCE: OAR 291-124-035(1)
NCCHC Standard P-C-04
DOC Policy 20.7, Employee Training and Development

PROCEDURE:

- A. All correctional officers in regular status positions shall receive training in the following health-related areas during new employee orientation:
1. Medic First Aid
 2. CPR - One Person Response
 3. Communicable/Infectious Diseases
 4. Recognition of Life Threatening and Serious Diseases
 5. Recognition of signs and symptoms of Mental Illness, Retardation and Chemical Dependency
 6. Access to Health Care
 7. Suicide Prevention
 8. Confidentiality of Health Care Information
- B. Correctional staff should receive training in the special health care needs of the adolescent.
- C. The minimum frequency for re-training in each of these subjects is every two years.
- D. Documentation of training is maintained by the ODOC Staff Training Section, and is available for review.
