****VISITING REMINDER****

Only 'basic' visits for DSU/Seg 1 inmates will need to be scheduled ahead of time.



Visits do not need to be scheduled ahead of time for general population inmates on basic visiting status or for those general population inmates with a visitor(s) on basic status . These visitors may show up on visiting days during normal visiting hours and will be served on a first-come, first-serve basis.

OSCI only allows four basic visits at one time (4 windows). As such, two windows have been designated for DSU/Seg 1 visits and the other two for basic general population visits.

Effective immediately, 'basic' visits (*for DSU/Segregation inmates only*) must be scheduled through Ms. R. Mondragon, Administrative Support at: (503) 373-0113. Visits will be scheduled on a first-come, first-serve basis. With a visiting facility that is designed to allow only four (4) basic visits at one time, this change was necessary due to the increase in basic visits here at OSCI. In an effort to inform OSCI visitors, this information will be posted in the Gatehouse and Visiting Facility. The OSCI website will also be updated to reflect this change. Thank you for your understanding and please make any necessary notifications and arrangements with your visitors.

Please remind your visitors that if they have a scheduled visit but are unable to keep their appointment to call and cancel as soon as possible.

CHAPEL MOVIE



On December 23, 2010, the Oregon Supreme Court released decisions for the following cases: *Janowski v. Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision* and *Fleming v. Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision*. The Board is working with its legal advisors to develop a plan to address those cases affected by the Court's ruling. FLAGGER CLASS

You too have the opportunity to become a certified flagger. Todd Cooper, a 10-year veteran flagger keeps the class lively and interesting. Flagging job opportunities are numerous and start about \$15 an hour. The class costs eighty dollars and includes five hours of training. If you do not pass the state certification, your money will be refunded in full. The next class will be scheduled when 12 individuals are signed up.

YOU MUST HAVE YOUR REQUESTS IN AND FEES PAID 2 WEEKS PRIOR TO ATTEND

Certification is through Chemeketa Community College, This certification does not guarantee employment, however it is good for three years and is valid in Oregon, Washington, Alaska, Arizona and Idaho. - Be able to work efficiently and professionally at all times

All applicants will need to pass a security screening and DMV interview before being considered for the position.
