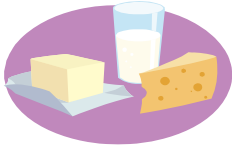
**Meditation Hour:** An hour and a half of mediation on Wednesday nights 7:00-8:30 pm in the Chapel.

## CHEMEKETA COMMUNITY COLLEGE

### College Inside Program

Have you ever thought about going to college?

If so, NOW is your chance. Chemeketa is currently looking for new, motivated students to enroll in our college program for Fall term starting in late September. Below are frequently asked questions to help you decide if this program is right for you.

The college Inside Program is designed to assist students in pursuing and achieving their Associate of Arts Oregon Transfer degree. This is a two-year degree program that will transfer to the four year universities in Oregon.

### Frequently Asked Questions

- **What times of the year are classes offered?**  
We offer classes all year long, for all four terms Fall, Winter, Spring, and Summer.
- **How many classes are offered?**  
Generally we offer 2-3 classes per term.
- **Are classes offered at night?**  
Almost all classes are offered during the evening to allow you to work your full shift during the day.
- **Can anybody take classes?**  
To be eligible for the college program you:
  - Must be in general population
  - Must have a high school diploma or GED
  - Must have 18 months clear conduct
  - Must be a Level 3 incentive
  - Must be able to pay for any text books by CD28 or outside support
  - Must not already have a college degree
- **How much does it cost?**  
Currently tuition costs \$78/credit hour. Most classes are 3 credit classes.
- **Can I get financial aid?**  
No, you cannot receive federal financial aid while you are incarcerated.
- **Are there any scholarships available?**  
Yes, we do have scholarships available. With the scholarship you pay \$25 per class plus the cost of books. To be eligible for the scholarship you must:
  - Have at least 1 year left on your sentence, but less than 6 years.
  - Be and remain DR free
  - Take at least 2 classes every term
  - Maintain a B average for the year
- **How do I sign up?**  
You need to send a kyte to Education expressing your interest in the college program. Once you are screened for eligibility you will be asked to write an essay about why you want to come to college then you will be added to the waiting list. If there is room for new students for the next term you will be called to register. Otherwise, you will be added to a waiting list for the next term.
- **What if I have more questions?**  
If you have any questions regarding this college program, or college in general, or financial aid, please send a kyte to Education



If you are interested, you **MUST** send a kyte by 9/15/09 in order to be screened for eligibility in time to start school.
