Earned Time Form Changes

The Earned Time Computation Form (CD 1154D) has been updated to include the possibility of 30% earned time. The final determination now reflects a general *None, Partial or Full* application of earned time to accommodate 0%, 10%, 20% and/or 0%, 15%, 30% earned time.

If you have questions about the earned time reflected on your Earned Time Computation Form, please direct those questions to the OISC Prison Term Analyst.

Notice to inmates

New programming was put into production that will now display the earned time percentage (0,20,30) on the facesheet of inmates serving sentencing guidelines sentences (there are no changes to the facesheet for matrix offenses). On the "Sent Reduct" field of the facesheet, next to the 'E' or 'R' coding (which reflects eligibility for earned time under ORS 137.750), a new field will now show "00", "20" or "30". The number in this field will reflect the percentage of earned time each particular sentence **may be** eligible to earn at each six-month review period. Below is a list of the various codes you may see on the facesheet and what the code means. Keep in mind that there are a number of other factors that may impact a sentence's overall eligibility for earned time.

- **E-00:** Sentence is eligible for earned time under ORS 137.750 but is not receiving earned time due to other factors (i.e. is also an ORS 137.700 sentence and therefore not eligible for earned time).
- **E-20:** Sentence is eligible for earned time under ORS 137.750 and is receiving 20% earned time reduction.
- **E-30:** Sentence is eligible for earned time under ORS 137.750 and is receiving 30% earned time reduction.
- **R-00:** Sentence is restricted from earned time under ORS 137.750 and is not receiving earned time reduction.
- **R-20:** Sentence is partially restricted from earned time under ORS 137.750 but will receive 20% on eligibility date.
- **R-30:** Sentence is partially restricted from earned time under ORS 137.750 but will receive 30% on eligibility date.

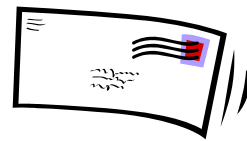

Universal Remote Coming Soon:

Due to popular demand, Commissary will soon be offering a universal remote to purchase. The remote is compatible with the 11" Access TV, 8" Music By Mail TV and the 7" #7813 TV One TV. There will be no warranty on these remotes. You must be in possession of one of the above listed TV's in order to purchase a remote. This is a reminder that it is your responsibility to keep all sales receipts in your possession. Commissary will provide copies to you at \$.50 per page. You must have funds in your account when you request copies.

1040 Envelopes:

This is a reminder that the Forever Stamp was approved statewide through the ISM's to affix to the 1040 envelopes. The Forever stamp will always be valid as First-Class postage on standard envelopes weighing one ounce or less, regardless of any subsequent increases in the First-Class rate.
