## Eastern Oregon Correctional Institution

Eastern Oregon Correctional Institution (EOCI) is a medium-security prison located in Pendleton, Oregon. The buildings that make up EOCI were constructed in 1912 and 1913 and were originally used as a state mental hospital. After two years of renovation, EOCI received its first inmates on June 24, 1985.
